Choices & Consequences: What to Do When a Teenager Uses Alcohol/Drugs by Dick Schaefer

If you are suspicious that your child may be using drugs, don't ignore the warning signs! Young people seldom grasp the concept of addiction and think of themselves as immune to danger. For some, drugs become a tempting escape from their world. If many of these signs seem applicable to your teen, don't despair. Effective help is always available. Following is a list of resources you can call for help.

1. withdrawal from responsibilities
2. verbally or physically abusive
3. loss of interest in family activities
4. sudden increase or decrease in appetite
5. disappearance of money or valuables
6. coming home late/missing curfew
7. not telling anyone where they are going
8. constant excuses for behavior
9. spending too much time in their room
10. lying about activities
11. sudden drop in grades
12. missing school
13. loss of interest in learning
14. sleeping in class
15. not doing homework
16. defiant of authority/violent outbursts
17. poor attitude towards activities they usually like
18. lack of motivation
19. reduced memory and attention span
20. changes in friends
21. smell of alcohol or marijuana on breath or body
22. slurred speech
23. glassy or red eyes
24. mood swings
25. negative, argumentative, paranoid, confused, destructive or anxious behavior
26. overreacts to criticism, acts rebellious
27. sharing few if any of their personal problems, feelings or thoughts
28. not as happy as they once were
29. overly tired or hyperactive
30. drastic change in weight
31. unhappy and depressed
32. cheats, steals
33. always needing money or having excessive amounts of money

34. sloppy appearance/poor self image
